## School News



The ninth National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence will be held on Friday 15 March 2019. This year we will be joining with other schools in support of positive learning environments and in sending a very clear message, that bullying and violence are never okay.

The day will provide an opportunity for us to focus on bullying and the big changes we can make to create safer communities for everyone. Let's Take a Stand Together.

## What We Know About Bullying

- Research has identified negative impacts, not only for those who are bullied, but for those who bully others and who witness bullying.
- The majority of students consider face-to-face bullying more harmful than online bullying.
- Hurtful teasing is the most common bullying behaviour, followed by being the subject of hurtful lies.
- Any characteristic that does not fit the norm, or sets a child apart from their peer group, places them at risk of being bullied.
- Young people are more concerned about online bullying by people they know, than they are about being bullied anonymously.
- Students commonly express a belief that bullying is wrong, but may experience concern about losing social status if they intervene.
- Teachers, parents and carers have a key role in modelling appropriate behaviour to students.
- Up to Year 6, parents and carers are the most likely person for students to tell about bullying. After this age, friends and peers are often the first person students will tell. Emerging evidence suggests a well-managed, integrated, whole-school approach to bullying is most likely to result in sustained positive change in the school and wider community

## Tell Them from Me Student Feedback Survey

This term, our school will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the Tell Them From Me student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes including student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the Tell Them From Me survey to help improve how they do things at school.

## Science Program - News from the Lab

Balgowlah Heights Public School runs a dedicated Science/Technology program for all students. K–2 students complete one hour per week led by Mrs Bowers. Mrs Irvine teaches Stage 2 Science and Ms Mellowes is taking Stage 3.

This term Early Stage 1 is studying 'Paddock to Plate' which looks at where their food comes from. Stage 1 is studying a unit called 'What's That Sound?' which looks at the science of sound. Stage 2 is investigating a unit called 'Melting Moments' which focuses on how solids and liquids are affected by temperature. Stage 3 is studying Earth and Space which focuses on the place of Earth in the Solar system and changes on its surface caused by natural disasters and the exploration of how these may be prevented. This year we are implementing the new Science/Technology Syllabus. If you have any expertise in any of these areas we would love to hear from you.

## Snowsports enthusiasts?



Would your child/ren like to participate in this year's **Interschools Snowsports Championships** and represent BHPS? For **alpine disciplines**, it is run in **Perisher 9-13 July 2019**, the first week of the winter school holidays. Competitors from all ability levels are encouraged to enter, with an emphasis on fun and participation in the initial Regional Championships. As the competitions move into the State and then the National event, the level of competition and the degree of difficulty increases. **Cross country** skiers compete directly in the State Championships in **Perisher 22 August**.

### Interschools Snowsports Disciplines

- **Alpine** - Skiers are timed on a modified giant slalom course
- **Skier X** - Skiers are timed on a slope-style course
- **Freestyle Moguls** - Skiers are scored on a bumps/jumps course
- **Snowboard Giant Slalom** - Boarders are timed on a modified giant slalom course
- **Snowboard X** - Boarders are timed on a slope-style course
- **Cross Country Freestyle** - Raced with skate/classic cross country skis with a mass start
- **Cross Country Relay** - 3 Person Relay (team only event)

There are different divisions based on age. It is a team based competition, but the kids also compete on an individual level.
