David Shuster Principal School zones operate between 8 - 9.30am and 2.30 - 4pm on school days.

The speed limit is 40km in all school zones.

We aim to improve road safety in school zone areas to protect children on their way to and from school.

It's important to understand the road conditions and signage in school zone areas. Please assist us by keeping our roads safe and educating your children to be safe around traffic.

Child safety is paramount and we make no apology for issuing infringements to drivers illegally parked in school zones. We are continuously conducting patrols during school terms to ensure child safety around our schools.

Please note:

Penalty rates are current as of 1 July 2018. Demerit points can increase the cost of your Greenslip.

No Parking

No Parking zones can be used to **drop off** and **pick up** children

- Drivers may stop to drop off or pick up passengers or goods for a maximum of 2 minutes.
- The driver must remain in or within 3 metres of the car
- Do not leave the vehicle unattended



Penalty \$187 and two demerit points

Bus Zone

Stopping is **not permitted** at any time.

 Drivers are not permitted to stop in a bus zone at any time. Unless, the sign shows times of operation, then the restriction only applies during those times.



Penalty \$337 and two demerit points

Driveways

Do not park across or on a driveway or any other vehicle access way.

Penalty \$337 and two demerit points



No Stopping

Stopping is **not permitted** at any time.

- Dropping off or picking up passengers is **not** permitted in these areas.
- A continuous yellow line on the edge of the road also indicates a No Stopping zone.





Double Parking

Double parking reduces visibility for other motorists and pedestrians.

- Vehicles must not stop next to legally parked vehicles, even for a short time.
- It is illegal to park within three metres of double white centre lines

Learning Support Program

At Balgowlah Heights Public School the Learning and Support Team plays a key role in ensuring we meet the specific needs of students with additional learning and support requirements.

We have been working closely with classroom teachers, providing extra assistance and support that enables students to meet their individual needs.

The Learning and Support Teachers have been busy implementing evidence based, best practice programs from Macquarie University in both literacy and numeracy this Term.

- Selected Year1 students MiniLit
- Selected Year 2 students MulitLit
- Selected Year 3 & 4 students MacqLit
- Selected Year 4 students Quicksmart Numeracy Program

In addition to these programs, the Learning and Support Team provide direct support for students through a range of strategies including, direct instruction, assessment and monitoring of progress, including the areas of social integration, language and communication, literacy, numeracy and behaviour.

Later in the year, selected students will be involved in the Kindy Lit Literacy Program.

School Invoices - P&C Contribution
