NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. Our school will be participating in NAPLAN Online between **12 May 2020 - 22 May 2020**.

Excessive preparation for NAPLAN Online is not recommended. Students can use the <u>public demonstration site</u> (https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site) to familiarise themselves with the functionalities and types of questions they will experience in NAPLAN Online. If you have any questions about NAPLAN Online you are welcome to contact the school. We will be holding a Year 3 Parent Information Session on Tuesday 7 April at 8.00am. Further information will be provided in the near future.

P&C Meeting on Monday night – Highlights

- This was a recap of the COVID-19 Update sent to parents by email on Monday 16 March this week. The focus is on hygiene, staying at home if unwell and social distancing in school time. The school takes its direction from the Department of Education so will be updating parents as and when there is any new information.
- David Shuster gave an in-depth presentation on research that has been done in the area of maths teaching at the
 school based partly on teacher and parent feedback as well as research by John Hattie, a distinguished and respected
 Education Professor at the University of Melbourne. This has resulted in changes being made in the way maths is
 taught and assessed at BHPS, including changing the Enrichment program to focus on mathematics only. For more
 detailed information, please see the minutes coming soon or contact the school.
- Discussion around the way homework is given resulted in raising awareness of the need for mathematics in particular to be more of a focus. The school Executive has committed to looking into this.

Canteen News

IMPORTANT MESSAGE RE COVID-19 MEASURES

We at the canteen, like everyone else in the community are taking extra hygiene measures. These are temporary, but we believe necessary. We appreciate your understanding and co-operation at this time.

No counter-service

Students will not be able to come to canteen during recess or lunch to purchase snacks over the counter. However, everything will still be available to **order on Flexischools**, so your child will not go hungry. Remember, you can **order both recess and lunch** through Flexischools.

No volunteers in Canteen

It is with much regret that we have to suspend volunteers in the canteen. We have been so lucky to have had such an uptake in volunteers this year that it pains us to ask you to stay home. Rest assured, as soon as we are able, we'll put the call out for you again!

Staggered lunch deliveries

To minimise students handling other student's food, lunch monitors will no longer collect lunches for the whole class. Instead, we will call each class individually, so that those with lunch orders can collect their own lunch from the canteen.

Possible shortages of supply

Woolies is one of our main suppliers. We have had difficulty getting timely supplies from them for the past two weeks. We will make every reasonable effort to keep our regular menu, but ask for your understanding if some things are unavailable.

Hygiene

We want to reassure parents that the canteen operates to very high levels of hygiene, as we are required to do, being in the food industry. In addition to our regular cleaning, we are sanitising surfaces several times a day.

Arabanoo

As all of you are aware the World Health Organisation declared the outbreak of COVID-19, a pandemic on the 11 March 2020. We are in close communication with Mr Shuster and Arabanoo are currently open as per the Department of Education quidelines.

Please find below how we plan to act in the various scenarios that may take place over the next few days/weeks. Thank you in advance for your understanding in this health emergency.

Health and Safety

The health and safety of all children and staff at Arabanoo are of the highest priority, with this in mind we have implemented the following infection control procedures for staff and the centre:

- Additional centre cleaning after every morning and afternoon shift.
- Staff and children washing their hands with soap and water upon arrival
- Children and staff washing their hands with soap and water regularly during the day in addition to before and after eating, and after using the toilet
- Covering coughs and sneezes with your elbow and disposing of tissues
- Sanitising of tables, benches, cutlery, plates and food preparation items

Staff Procedures

With the increased spread of the virus and working in close proximity with large numbers of children and adults we have implemented the following to reduce the risk.

- All staff have been asked if they are displaying cold/flu like symptoms to stay away from work with immediate effect and seek further medical advice. If deemed fit to return to work by a doctor, that staff member may return to work.
- Currently we have three staff members who this has impacted.
- We have two staff members who are currently overseas and they have been requested to self-isolate for 14 days upon their return this week.

Parent notification of a child's absence - Please inform us immediately

Thank you to those parents who are already informing us of absences. We understand that many parents have been requested to work from home and we ask if you know you no longer require care for this week and next to please let us know ASAP so we can staff accordingly. Please do this via the My Family Lounge app or via email.

Stay at home - Keep your child at home if unwell

If your child is displaying cold/flu like symptoms we request they be kept at home until they are fit to return to school. If your child is sent to Arabanoo with cold/flu like symptoms, you will be contacted and requested to collect your child as soon as practicable.

Communication with Arabanoo - Please email

The Arabanoo office will be manned as best as possible but during the day admin staff may be working from home. Please dont leave voicemails on the office or mobile but rather communicate via email to ensure your message is received. Please keep a close eye on your email as any further communication will be communicated from admin@arabanoo.com.

Term time casual bookings - Paused

As a result of staff availability, we will not be accepting any casual bookings until further notice.

Term time - Pick Up

As of today (18 March 2020) we will operating from the senior campus only. Our sign out desk will be outside on the deck and we request that parents dont enter the centre upon pick up.

Vacation care - Limited availability

We are still accepting bookings for the up and coming vacation care period with the following amendments. In the case that the school and Arabanoo remains open we will be operating at half our usual capacity which will be 44 children per day and all excursions will be cancelled. At present incursions are still taking place with strict hygiene practices in place. This is in line with the latest Department of Education release (find link below) to cancel any unnecessary excursions and to ensure we have enough staff to safely provide care for your children.

In the case that vacation care is cancelled no fees will be charged to parents and you will be made aware of the closure as soon as we are informed. Bookings will be assessed as normal on a first come first served basis and processed this time next week.

Financial FAQs

1. What happens to the fees I have already paid should the school and Arabanoo close during term?

Term fees paid for days when the centre closed due to NSW Department of Education's action will be refunded as soon as possible considering admin staff availability.

2. What happens to term fees already paid when my child(ren) can't attend Arabanoo due to illness?

Arabanoo's current policy states term fees are payable for sick days. This measure will continue to apply and allows the centre to adhere to Child Care Management System (CCMS) policy in relation to absences.

3. What happens to term fees paid when I choose to keep my child(ren) at home?

Arabanoo's current policy requires parents to give 2 weeks' notice when cancelling bookings. This measure will continue to apply and helps Arabanoo remain financially viable.

4. What happens to staff while the centre is closed?

Arabanoo value their staff and always aim to support them to the maximum extent possible. All staff will receive individual communication about support and entitlements should the service be mandated to close.

5. How long can the centre afford to be closed?

Arabanoo holds cash surpluses to meet any unanticipated reductions in revenue. The current buffer is considered sufficient to operate the centre with no revenue until the end of the calendar year.

6. When will I be charged for my autumn vacation care (VC) bookings?

Arabanoo currently accepts VC booking requests, however, will only process these for payment once we're certain of opening. Operating under the principle of only charging parents for services provided any VC fees paid for days that did not proceed will be refunded as soon as possible. As you can appreciate this is a very busy time for everyone and we value your time and patience whilst this situation develops. As for now we will be operating with our calm and fun approach, and as always, your childs safety and wellbeing is our main priority.
