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Principal's Message

COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

Detailed below is information from the Department of Education regarding schools and student learning programs.

Schools remain open

The health advice on schools remains unchanged. Our Chief Medical Officers indicate that our schools should remain open for education provision at this time. The Government and Department are encouraging you to keep your child at home from Tuesday 24 March to contribute to supporting the community response to COVID-19. The school's doors will remain open for those students whose parents are in the essential services or who are vulnerable. As updated expert information comes to the Department, who are in constant liaison with NSW Health we will keep you informed of any impact on school operations.

• Supporting continuity of learning for all students

Our staff have been working hard to develop a suite of learning resources and options for students to undertake from home. The Department has developed and will continue to develop resources and offer professional learning to help teachers with this task. Whether your child is at school or at home, the aim is for all students to access the consistent learning content provided by our school.

Support for students at home

I encourage you to access the <u>Learning from Home</u> resource which provides practical advice to parents and carers on how to best create and support a productive learning environment in the home. In addition to this all families were emailed a week's unit of work on Monday of this week. During the remainder of this term new units of study will be provided each Monday. The school staff are also working tirelessly on remote materials for the future. The primary platforms we will use are SeeSaw (Years K to 3) and Google Classrooms (Years 4 to 6). Further information will be forwarded on these platforms later this week.

All extra-curricular activities (bands, strings, recorders, dance groups, drama group, choirs, robotics, tech club, debating, chess, the Music Bus, Headstart Mandarin and Science Club) are cancelled until further notice.

Short notice - check emails

As you can appreciate, we are managing operations day by day and we will do our best to give you notice of a closure, change to our program or opening hours, however this may out of our hands and be at short notice. Please keep a close eye on your emails.

Survey Monkey - please complete

Thank you to those 137 families who have already completed the survey. Our position remains unchanged from last week in that our service for families remains open in accordance with the Department's decision to keep the schools open, enabled by our capacity and staff safety and availability to look after the children.

As communicated with you last week, we are still planning to accommodate 44 children during Vacation Care, starting on the 14 April with now incursions and excursions cancelled.

We are seeing daily attendances drop during Term time with parents electing to keep their children home. So we are asking you to reconfirm some important details to ensure that we can provide a service to families whom are most in need, which we deem as those working in the essential services that the government has declared currently remain open https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/7QZ22BK

Term Time Cancellations - please email

Thank you to all those parents who have let us know about cancelling your booking, if you no longer require your Term booking please let us know via email.

Cancellation of permanent bookings - We've got your back

We will be honouring all current permanent family spots when we open back up normally and will not offer places to new families until we hear from you. An email will be sent out confirming further details at the time.

Vacation Care - Various

We are currently running vacation care but due to the reduced numbers and guidelines the government have set we will be cancelling all excursions and now incursions. The programming team are putting together a super fun program in the meantime for those families requiring care.

• Fees

All vacation care fees will be a flat rate of \$75 irrelevant of when booked or activity and all cancellation or changes to booking fees will be waived.

• Priority of bookings

If we reach capacity we will be prioritising families working in essential services and single parent families working to our capacity of 44 children per day.

• Confirmation

Please check your emails for updates on vacation care. A confirmation email will be sent today (Wednesday 25 March). If you don't receive an email please let us know.

Cancellation

If you need to cancel your booking please let us know via email.

Mariah - back this week

Mariah has been overwhelmed with all the emails and well wishes from families, thank you. It's with great pleasure to say she'll be starting back to work later this week. She'll be sporting a brand new helmet, fixed up bike and is looking forward to being back.

Signing in/out - leave it to the staff

To try and reduce the amount of contact, our staff will sign your child in/out via the iPad. Speak to the supervisor on duty for assistance.

Social Distancing - maintain guidelines

We are finding groups of parents congregating on school site after picking up their child. Please maintain the set social distancing guidelines and we ask that once you have picked up your child you make your way from the school site.

The BIG Question - will "wacky shirt Wednesday's" continue?

Well, we can firmly say, if we're open then wacky shirt Wednesday's will continue and we welcome all children and parents to join in. Financial FAQs

- 1. What happens to the fees I have already paid should the school and Arabanoo close during term? Term fees paid for days when the centre is closed due to NSW Department of Education's action will be refunded as soon as possible considering admin staff availability.
- 2. What happens to term fees already paid when my child(ren) can't attend Arabanoo due to illness? Arabanoo's current policy states term fees are payable for sick days. This measure will continue to apply and allows the centre to adhere to Child Care Management System (CCMS) policy in relation to absences.
- 3. What happens to term fees paid when I choose to keep my child(ren) at home? Arabanoo's current policy requires parents to give 2 weeks' notice when cancelling bookings. This measure will continue to apply and helps Arabanoo remain financially viable.
- 4. What happens to staff while the centre is closed? Arabanoo value their staff and always aim to support them to the maximum extent possible. All staff will receive individual communication about support and entitlements should the service be mandated to close.
- 5. How long can the centre afford to be closed? Arabanoo holds cash surpluses to meet any unanticipated reductions in revenue. The current buffer is considered sufficient to operate the centre with no revenue until the end of the calendar year.
- 6. When will I be charged for my autumn vacation care (VC) bookings?

Arabanoo currently accepts VC booking requests, however, will only process these for payment once we are certain of opening. Operating under the principle of only charging parents for services provided and any VC fees paid for days that did not proceed will be refunded as soon as possible.
