PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Semester 2 Student Reports

On Friday (26 November 2021) of this week Semester 2 Student Reports will be emailed to parents. Based on Department of Education Guidelines, the Reports have been adjusted in recognition of the impact of the home learning program. Reflecting the adjustments required for students, the report will not grade student achievement or effort using the five-point scale (Outstanding to Limited) as in previous reports. The Report indicates work that has been submitted during the home learning program, focusing on English and mathematics. The report will be complemented by an optional parent | teacher interview where the class teacher will focus on academic progress, future directions, wellbeing and identify what can be done to support learning growth.

Term 3 and 4 Invoices

P&C Meeting & Annual General Meeting (AGM)

Monday nights' meeting was full of interesting information from school and an end of year report from the P&C. Full minutes will be available next week, however, here are some highlights:

AGM

• roles were nominated and accepted with one vacant role (Vice President – Services)

School update:

- Current enrolment is 728
- The school is now on Level 3 Covid restriction level which means we can now have recognition assemblies, talent quests, Year 6 Play and party days following appropriate protocols.
- Christmas Teacher Gifts The generosity of parents gifting teachers is very much appreciated. However, any gift more than \$50 has to be declared to the DoE. It would be more appropriate to limit parent contribution to \$10 per family in the future.
- The Manly Daily recently published an article on Northern Beaches School. The article stated that 'A recent study undertaken by the Better Education Group marks schools out of 100 and then ranks them on performance'. The article stated that Balgowlah Heights Public School is the top performing public school (ranked 94 in the State) with a score of 98 and third overall on the Northern Beaches (two private schools were #1 & #2). A great recognition of the hard work of all teachers, staff, students and parents.
- 2022 School Planning To keep class sizes at an optimum level (between 21 28), Mr Shuster would really like 31 classes next year which would mean the school funding 2 additional teachers (\$160,000) the Department of Education will fund 29 teachers. Paying Term 3 and 4 invoices will help to ensure we can achieve all the resources we require for our students.
- Years 3-6 Check-In Assessment Results these have provided a good guide to assist the school in understanding the impact of home learning. Measurement and geometry will be a focus for Numeracy next year, as well as punctuation and grammar for Reading. Standardised testing is also happening Years 2-6. Most children went well in home schooling and there are areas of next steps included in the end of Semester reports.





- School finances an average of 63% students have paid T3 and T4 invoices (37% still to pay). All
 money the school receives go back into the students. New policy from Department of Education
 any money given in that year must be spent in that year (can't stockpile funds). Mr Shuster
 requests that if you are able to, can you please pay your Terms 3 and 4 invoice to allow us to
 purchase all the resources for the future.
- Congratulations to Mrs Lockhart who is now employed as a permanent Deputy Principal.

P&C update:

- The President's Report highlighted a number of initiatives and activities that were undertaken throughout the year with a special thanks to all the volunteers who have helped during the year (the list is very long of amazing people so please see the full report here to read some of the fabulous things that have happened this year).
- Treasurer's Report Total revenue for 2021 is \$160,000 plus auction proceeds (will be approx. \$10,000 lower than a normal year). Government cashflow boosts were a large part of this. Parent contribution is key.
- Canteen is 30% down in revenue and Uniform shop will be about 10% down. A huge thank you to all canteen and uniform shop staff for managing a difficult year.
- Band there will be a separate committee for band managed in a similar way to P&C. If you have an interest in joining the band committee please contact Diana Worman (bhpspresident@gmail.com.au) or Caroline Fechner (bhpsconcertband@optusnet.com.au)
- There is a new Sustainability Committee (thank you to those that are stepping down and welcome to those joining) and a Road Safety Committee.
- School banking has now ceased in all schools.
- Thank you and farewell to Nicole Larcombe who has been a member of the P&C Committee for the last 7 years. Her knowledge, positive approach and general presence will be sorely missed by all. Thank you for your contribution you have helped make the P&C and school a better place.

Uniform update # 6 – Q&A

We have collated a few of the frequently asked questions regarding uniform and the changes occurring over the past few weeks:

Q: My child is in Year 4 and we would like to order the new navy skort – will it be available to order in Summer 2022/2023 for Year 4?

A: Currently we only have Navy Skorts in Kindy/Infant sizes, but it is planned to have these for sale during Term 3 for Summer 2022/2023.

Q: I've heard a rumour about socks – can you please clarify?

A: We will be moving toward a Navy Blue sock with the regular uniform. Likely to be rolled out with the Summer uniform later in 2022. White socks for sport.

Q: My child might be joining the OC class in 2022 - do we buy the new uniform?

A: Children in Years 4, 5 and 6 will likely remain in the current uniform until they graduate from BHPS. Given the current stock levels, new 2022 OC students will be offered uniform items in line with their cohort.

Q: Will the winter tunic dress still be available?

A: The grey tartan winter tunic will be available for Kindy to Year 2. The grey tartan skirt will be available for Years 3 to 6.

Q: Can my son purchase the white polo for summer?

A: From January 2022, all uniform items are available to all students. The white polo shirt is a discontinued item, and will be replaced by the Sky Blue polo when stock runs out.
