

Welcome back to 2021 at Balgowlah Heights Public School library! We are beginning the year with a different format of co-teaching K-6. Classes will come to the library for lessons with their class teacher and the teacher/librarian. Lessons will include quality literature appreciation, browsing and borrowing, library processes and protocols and information literacy based on key learning areas.

This Sunday is Library Lover's Day....yes, the same day as Valentine's Day. There is nothing better than discovering a book that may make a difference to your life after reading it.



Students will also have the opportunity to participate in the Premier's Reading Challenge. Last year, students in K-2 completed it in class and during library lessons. Students K-6 were offered an optional participation. However, students are unable to drop in and out if they wish to achieve the coveted platinum certificate at the completion of Year 6. The Premier's Reading Challenge begins on March 1 with the end date being August 20.
