Outside of school: I race for Newport SLSC and am currently competing in the Nutri-Grain Series. If I am not out training, I'll be surfing or playing golf.







2021 Scripture and Ethics Classes

A feature of the public education system in NSW is the opportunity to provide time in class for education in ethics, faith and morality from a religious or non-religious perspective at the choice of parents. The school website https://belmoresth-p.schools.nsw.gov.au/learning-at-our-school/religion-and-ethics.html provides information on these options to support parent/carer choice.

A parent/carer may at any time notify the school in writing that they wish to change their decision. Students will continue the same arrangement as the previous year, unless a parent/carer has requested a change in writing. The following options are available at Balgowlah Heights Public School and are delivered by approved providers:

- Catholic Scripture
- Ethics
- Greek Orthodox
- Protestant Scripture

Separation Anxiety

What is Separation Anxiety?

It is normal for children to feel some anxiety when separating from their parents. This generally begins around 8 months of age and peaks at 14-18 months. At this age some anxiety around separation is adaptive as it is the time children start to crawl. In most children this resolves in time, however, some school age children still experience some anxiety when separated from their loved ones.

Separation anxiety becomes a disorder when the difficulty of separating begins to have significant negative effects on the child's (and caregiver's) life and has been ongoing for more than 4 weeks.

Strategies for Separation Anxiety

- Have a regular routine before school, stick it up on the fridge in words or pictures
- Practice separations
- Set up a system to reward good separations
- Try a transitional object such as a picture or a soft toy that they can hold when they feel worried
 or sad
- Seek support from friends, teachers and other health professionals
- Control your own anxiety, if you are anxious or sad about leaving your child they will pick up on your emotions and reflect them back
- Do not linger at the school gate or create drawn out farewells this can increase anxiety for your child and make it harder for them to separate
- Do not disappear when they are not watching, this will create uncertainty and make future separations more difficult

How can the school help? Please talk to your child's classroom teacher if your child is having difficulty separating from you in the mornings. Teachers are equipped and more than happy to assist. They might suggest a special job for your child in the morning to ease their transition, set up a buddy for your child or they may recommend receiving further support either from within the school or externally.
