Peer Support

Last Thursday, there was a buzz in the air! Year 6 Peer Support leaders found the confidence and courage to lead their first Peer Support session after undergoing two days of training last term. K-6 students made their way across campuses into small, mixed year groups to undertake and engage with Peer Support sessions based on keeping friends. Students K-6 were provided with engaging friendship activities to connect through communication and sharing of ideas.

Connectedness is one of the top indicators of child wellbeing. We need to feel connected to others to thrive and flourish, but it's especially critical for mental health and development in school aged children. Samantha Brown, CEO of Peer Support Australia, said: "Providing opportunities for intentional connection can make a big difference to students' sense of belonging and self-esteem."

This week's peer led session on Thursday, 4th August, is <u>Cooperating and Listening</u>. We are looking forward to building rapport and friendships in our peer groups. Students investigate relationships, resilience, optimism and values. The lessons are designed to equip students with skills to deal with life experiences, promote wellbeing, build positive relationships and connectedness, and to encourage a sense of responsibility.

Current BHPS Recycling Programs

Bottles, Cans, & Poppers	ReCollect - Please continue to drop your eligible 10c refundable containers behind the letterbox of 44 Woodland St S. So far, over 5,000 containers have been donated this year, contributing funds to BHPS Sustainability Initiatives!
Bread Bags Recycling	A PINK WONDER RECYCLING REWARDS collection box is outside the Office on the western campus, where you can deposit ALL soft plastic bread bags (not just Wonder branded bread bags), until 9th September. "The rule of thumb is that if it has contained bread of some sort and is a soft plastic – then it's a bread bag". Collections will be weighed and recycled into things like school benches, exercise circuits and bollards and BHPS will receive reward points, which will be converted into sports equipment for the school. Win-Win!
Textile Rescue Program	A YELLOW WORN UP collection box is outside the Office on the western campus, where you can deposit all worn out school uniforms. It was estimated over 2000 tonnes a year of uniform textiles end up in Australian landfill, and this Sustainable Schoolwear company is closing the loop and recycling them.

Other BHPS Sustainability News:

- TerraCycle has partnered with Bic, and Colgate, • to recycle all brands of Writing Instruments (pens, markers, highlighters, empty correction and fluid tape & pots) Oral Care Products (toothbrushes, toothpaste tubes, floss containers, & electric toothbrush heads). We'll be starting a BHPS collection soon, so please start saving these items from the general waste. Drop off details to follow later this term...
- Ocean Action Pod is coming to BHPS in September! Total Environment Centre has produced a multimedia interactive educational space that can come to the school & engage the kids in ocean plastic pollution issues. The pod will entertain and inspire, with an array of positive
